



LRC Policy on Race Protests

The NSWRA Laws of Boat Racing provide for the opportunity to lodge protests.

LRC regards lodging a protest as a serious matter that needs both due consideration and ratification by the Club Executive.

If a crew genuinely believes they were impeded in a race, then the stroke of that crew may lodge a verbal protest with the race umpire at the conclusion of the race.

Should the stroke or any club member wish to lodge the required formal written protest, they must discuss this first with one of the available Executive Committee members (President, Captain, Treasurer and Secretary), by phone if necessary, to gain approval to proceed.

No club member may lodge a formal protest without the express approval of one of the Club Executive.

Normally, the Captain will represent the club at the jury meeting for the consideration of a protest.

Any breach of this policy may result in sanctions for the member responsible.
